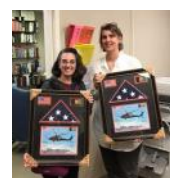
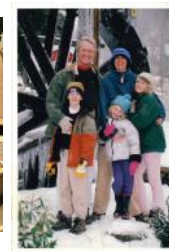

TO THIS WEEKEND: This Sunday, we will celebrate Martha Kearse's 16-years of staff ministry among us. We will commission her to serve as pastor of Peakland Baptist Church, in Lynchburg, Virginia. We are excited to learn that several members of Peakland have accepted our invitation and will be with us to participate in our prayer of commissioning. Our worship of The Living God this Sunday will include Martha baptizing five youth girls who were children when Martha served as Minister with Children (2001-2012). We will conclude the worship hour with a prayer of commissioning and present some tangible love gifts. Following worship, we will enjoy a reception in honor of Martha, Monty, Mattie, Conner and Anna. Dream Big for the 21st Century, St. John's!

As you know, the church has received \$130,000 for sale of 980 square feet of property along Park Drive to the City of Charlotte for a transformer for the new trolley line. We also have a signed contract for \$600,000 with Lincoln-Harris for the sale of the Garrison Road property, although we have no idea if or when the money will be paid.

Back in the fall, the Administrative deacon panel appointed a task force to solicit ideas about what to do with these funds. The Investing in the Future task force consists of David Allen, Randy Brantley, Bill Claytor, Charlie Harper, Bill Hartsell, Wanny Hogewood, Fredda Kimball, Russell Norris, Bobbi Sherrill, Meredith Sorrell, Sara Vavra, and Sally Young, chair.

Although the task force initially thought we would ask for ideas of projects to use this money, we quickly came to the conclusion that this money would be much better spent in seeking solutions for St. John's strategic challenges. We have thus far identified two:

- The church must attract young people to make its future sustainable.
- Our facilities are old and require significant maintenance.

We know the members of our congregation are thoughtful and have ideas that could make a huge difference for the future of St. John's. Therefore, over the next several weeks, members of the IF task force will visit Sunday school classes and hold meetings to hear what you think we should do about our strategic challenges.

We want to hear your thoughts and ideas! Buttonhole any of us and tell us what you think. Write us a letter or send an email. Wonderful things go on in our community of faith. How can we share St. John's with the larger Charlotte community? What steps do we need to take to ensure the future of the church?

Here are the Questions for Listening Sessions:

1. How can we use this money to further the mission of St. John's?
2. What does St. John's need to do to assure its future?
3. What do we need to do to attract more new members, especially young people, while continuing to be true to our identity and mission at St. John's?
4. Why should St. John's exist in 10, 20, or 100 years from now?
5. What should be the mission of St. John's?
6. How can we use these monies to propel us to larger visions of our future?
7. If money were no object, what would you like to see us do?
8. What is our ultimate aim as a church in Charlotte today?
