SIX SACRED SEASONS OF TRANSITION

Last Sunday, beloved, you celebrated in true St. John's style! Well done!

As we journey forward amidst change, we will walk through what I refer to as 'Six Sacred Seasons of Transition.' Each season is marked less by weather or the calendar and more by our context. And, each season blends into or overlaps a bit with the seasons it touches.

CELEBRATING: The first sacred season is Celebrating. I have always believed that congregations need to show the world how to celebrate God's calling and God's leadership in the lives of ministers in healthy ways. Yet, most of the time, this does not happen. You celebrated so well in recent days culminating in a tremendous outpouring of love last Sunday. You gave thanks to God for the joys, laughter and meaningful moments we have enjoyed with Martha Kearse and her family. You embraced the wonderful gifts of witnessing the baptisms of five young women, being led in worship by children of St. John's, and commissioning Martha into the pastorate of Peakland Baptist Church of Lynchburg, Virginia. Our celebrating will continue as we rejoice in Martha's new opportunity to follow God's calling.

GRIEVING: When relationships change, grief emerges. We must value grief and respond to change in ways that promote health for us as individuals and as an active faith community. Phone calls, notes, hugs, listening and sharing stories are essential. We must protect ourselves against unhealthy responses to change: flight or fight. Each of these unhealthy responses cause us to become victims of change. In flight, we become refugees trying to create distance between ourselves and the change. In fight, we become bitter and brittle resisting new realities accompanying change. A healthy response to change includes honest grieving, allowing time for new opportunities to emerge. In honest grieving, we mourn what will never be the same while giving thanks for the memories and shared meanings. For the next few weeks, we will listen to one another in this season of grieving.

FALLOWING: Grieving will gradually give way to a sacred season of fallowing. In agriculture, fallow ground is unplanted – but is not idle. During fallowing season, new germinating occurs and sprouting emerges while enabling rest, renewal and strengthening. Also, during fallowing, that which is unnecessary dissipates. The ministry staff has already reviewed notes Martha left behind to identify how we will carefully tend the ministries she touched. From April through the summer, we will notice what is happening. What shows the need for special attention? How does new creativity emerge? What new voices and initiatives sprout? What is happening beneath the surface? During the sacred season of fallowing, we honor the reality that change also brings new opportunities.

DISCERNING: In late summer, we will integrate conversations facilitated by our *Investing in the Future Task Force* with goals included in *St. John's Vision 2020*.

We will explore optional scenarios as we consider alternatives of staffing for future ministries focused on growth in the 21st century. We must guard against thinking we know all the answers before we have determined the questions. We must listen to one another and study our context. Through congregational processes, church leaders will hear you as they identify needs, clarify visions and move forward remembering this is a spiritual process requiring prayer and discernment of God's guidance. We will avoid the ditches on either side of our path — the ditch of making consequential decisions too quickly in a 'problem-fix-it' mode on one side and the ditch of becoming stuck in the paralysis of analysis at the other extreme.

DECIDING: Sometime in the autumn of 2018, we will have allowed for enough time and conversation to decide how we want to structure our staff for future ministry. We must not be hasty; yet, some areas of emphasis seem to be easier to identify than others. Once we build profiles for a position or positions, we will enter the final sacred season, **SEARCHING**. I do not see us welcoming anyone new to the church staff in these discerned roles until early to mid-2019. This process has many far-reaching implications for the future of St. John's. We all want to get this right!
