

Naturalization Workshop

Todd Stillerman has been working through the Bank of America Legal Department with the Latin America Coalition to staff naturalization workshops in Mecklenburg County. These workshops provide free legal advice to immigrants with permanent resident status on how to fill out their N-400 forms to apply for naturalized U.S. citizenship. One of these workshops will be held at St. John's in Broach Hall on Saturday, July 14th from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm. In addition to providing space for the workshop, we have the opportunity to help in the following ways:



- Volunteers to assist with check-in and greeting from 8 AM to 2 PM (can work in shifts)
- Volunteers to help with refreshments, including set-up and clean-up.

 requires participation in a 1 hour training session at Latin American Coalition at a
 time to be determined.

2018 Global Mission Offering The Nyarweng Primary School, South Sudan Goal - \$15,000—Received \$8,090

St. John's ministry to The Nyarweng Primary School began in 2008 when Lubo (one of the Lost Boys of Sudan who was resettled to Charlotte), then age 25, returned to his village for the first time since fleeing at the age of 8. Amidst the sadness, he found a hopeful people, holding classes in the shade of trees or in makeshift temporary structures. When asked what they most wanted, the village leaders answered, "We want a better life for our children. We want education. We want our own school."

During this year's offering, we are hoping to raise \$15,000 (send checks to St. John's and write "The Nyarweng School" on the memo line) AND we want to send a backpack to Nyarweng full of good will in the form of letters and art. Members of all ages are asked to address the letters to a young or older child or to a teacher or parent. Share a piece of yourselves in your letter, perhaps even a picture of your family. What unites us — our love of God, hope for our children, and appreciation of a dependable friend - is far greater than what separates us. Remember that these people have heard of you and St. John's, and they pray for you when they worship on Sundays in the school. Perhaps we will hear back from some of Nyarweng's students and teachers.

PLEASE JOIN ME IN INTERCESSORY PRAYER

Douglas Steere was a Quaker writer and teacher. A professor of philosophy at Haverford College and Union Seminary, he initiated post-war relief work in the late 1940s in Norway, Poland and Finland. He was invited to be an ecumenical participant in the Second Vatican Council with St. John's own Claude Broach. He co-founded the Ecumenical Institute for Spirituality.

One of my favorite marked passages in Douglas Steere's writing is the following reference to intercessory prayer: "Intercession is the most intensely social act that the human being is capable of doing." (Dimensions of Prayer)

- 1. In your prayers, intercede with me on behalf of:
- 2. The children, youth and young adults who are involved with us for Freedom School, 2018. They are an impressive group.
- 3. Our Leadership Development Team as they enlist our deacons, resource teams, task forces and ministry leaders for 2018-2019.
- 4. Our youth as they continue to be involved in learning and servant ministries this summer.
- 5. Our continued efforts to give \$15,000 to help pay teacher salaries for the community school in Nyarweng, South Sudan. This Global Mission Offering emphasis will continue during the rest of the summer. Have you written a note to a teacher or a student and placed it inside the backpack near the pulpit?
- 6. Kevin Gray and our Technology Resource Team as they move toward the installation phase of our new sanctuary sound system and livestreaming video system. This effort will also vastly upgrade our sound and video systems in Broach Hall.
- Our church staff as we coordinate plans for the 2018-2019 church year. In September, you will receive a booklet highlighting major dates and emphases for September 2018 through August 2019.

If you believe the discipline of prayer makes a difference in you and in the life of St. John's, please join me in intercessory prayer.
