We have had for many years a partnership with these two agencies, both with our allocations in the annual budget of the church and with volunteers who provide hands-on services. We heard from Bert Green last Sunday about the value of our helping people build a home of their own. Through Urban Ministries volunteers from St. John's make 200 sandwiches each month and staff a weekly Room in the Inn ministry during the winter months. On March 10 we will hear from Katie Church of Urban Ministries about these and other services provided by that agency for the homeless in our community.

Galilee Pantry provides protein foods for their clients such as chicken, eggs, cheese. While you shop for non-perishables, L&F shops for these perishable items with your monetary donations.
