Donna Morris-Pastoral Panel


How many years have you been a member of St. John's? 57 years

Surely, Christian community is one of the greatest blessings Christ has given us.

What is your vision for St. John's? My prayer for St. John's is that we will be a congregation that is healthy, open, loving, and indeed a beacon of God's love to the world, starting at East Fifth and Hawthorne and going wherever God shows us needs to meet.
