PRAYERFUL CALL TO WORSHIP Rev. Benfield

ONE: Come and worship. Turn from the distractions of the world, for just this small moment, to worship God.

ALL: Our worst temptations are not hedonism, egoism or materialism.

ONE: Our worst temptation is to believe the often-repeated image of a one-false-move God, an accountant God who keeps score and demands payments.

ALL: We are tempted to believe that God is like us rather than striving to be like God.

ONE: We find it hard to fully embrace the no-matter-whatness of God – to rest in the hands of a God who’s just plain-old too busy loving us to be disappointed in us.

ALL: We find overwhelming, all-accepting love unbelievable because, like the universe, like quarks, like eternity, it is a concept that far surpasses our human capacity.

ONE: So, we gather here to worship the One who chooses us in spite of our unbelief, our weakness, our hubris.

ALL: We worship God who creates us, redeems us, and sustains us.

ONE: Come and worship.

READING FROM ACTS OF THE APOSTLES Kevin Turner
Acts 10:1-16

In Caesarea there was a man named Cornelius, a centurion of the Italian Cohort, as it was called. He was a devout man who feared God with all his household; he gave alms generously to the people and prayed constantly to God. One afternoon at about three o’clock he had a vision in which he clearly saw an angel of God coming in and saying to him, “Cornelius.” He stared at him in terror and said, “What is it, Lord?” He answered, “Your prayers and your alms have ascended as a memorial before God. Now send men to Joppa for a certain Simon who is called Peter; he is lodging with Simon, a tanner, whose house is by the seaside.” When the angel who spoke to him had left, he called two of his slaves and a devout soldier from the ranks of those who served him, and after telling them everything, he sent them to Joppa. About noon the next day, as they were on their journey and approaching the city, Peter went up on the roof to pray. He became hungry and wanted something to eat; and while it was being prepared, he fell into a trance. He saw the heaven opened and something like a large sheet coming down, being lowered to the ground by its four corners. In it were all kinds of four-footed creatures and reptiles and birds of the air. Then he heard a voice saying, “Get up, Peter; kill and eat.” But Peter said, “By no means, Lord; for I have never eaten anything that is profane or unclean.” The voice said to him again, a second time, “What God has made clean, you must not call profane.” This happened three times, and the thing was suddenly taken up to heaven.

About Today’s Proclaimer

For many Sundays, we have heard Delbridge Narron play the piano as worship begins. Today, we will hear from Delbridge as our proclaimer. Delbridge E. Narron was ordained by Wake Forest Baptist Church in Winston-Salem. He has served as a deacon at Old Cambridge Baptist Church in Cambridge, Massachusetts, at Madison Avenue Baptist Church in New York City, and at Wedgewood Baptist Church in Charlotte. He served as the interim pastor of the First Baptist Church of Littleton, Massachusetts, and as pastor of North Hunterdon Baptist Church, in Glen Gardner, New Jersey. Delbridge did one unit of clinical pastoral education at Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem.



Delbridge is a native of North Carolina and grew up in the Charlotte area. Delbridge is an Eagle Scout and a Vigil Honor Member of the Order of the Arrow. Delbridge earned an M.Div. in 1987 at Union Theological Seminary in New York City, attending as a Union Scholar. He earned his J.D. in 1996 at New York University School of Law in Manhattan. Delbridge currently works as General Counsel of Springs Global US, Inc., headquartered in Fort Mill, South Carolina. Delbridge is the chairperson of the Advisory Board for the Honors College at UNC Charlotte and teaches a course in constitutional law for the Honors College one semester a year. He was named the 2019 Honorary Alumnus for UNC Charlotte. In lieu of progeny, Delbridge endowed the Delbridge Narron Scholarship in the Honors College of UNC Charlotte. His hobbies include reading and music. Until retiring as of Easter Sunday 2015, Delbridge was the accompanist for Wedgewood Baptist Church for fifteen years. While working for North Hunterdon Baptist Church in Glen Gardner, New Jersey, Delbridge founded the AIDS Network in Hunterdon County, the first AIDS service organization in that area, and helped found the North Hunterdon Community Food Bank and Voorhees Village Preschool.


