OUR ST. JOHN'S COVENANT & NEW WINESKINS

"Nothing moves more slowly than a church." William Barclay wrote this comment about Jesus' words, "new wine must be put into new skins." Barclay wrote, "There is in religious people a kind of passion for the old. Nothing moves more slowly than a church. The trouble with the Pharisees was that the whole religious outlook of Jesus was so startlingly new they could simply not adjust to it." We all know that when the human mind loses elasticity, it has increased difficulty accepting new ideas and change. For generations, St. John's has embraced adventurous thoughts, new approaches and inclusive initiatives, so long as the foundational theology is motivated by God's compassion. We seek to be responsible and purposeful with new ideas and changes. When Jesus said, "new wine must be put into new skins," he was reminding people that wineskins, the wine bottles of Jesus' day, became hardened and inflexible with time. Basically, Jesus was saying, 'Don't let your thinking become like an old wineskin.'

This autumn, my messages have focused on a season of covenant renewal. My messages have asked us to consider 'new wine skins' for our St. John's Covenant. I have connected each message to the theme, Strengthening Our Connection with God's Heart. Our Covenant gives us something on which we can agree in a culture focused on disagreement and dissension.

Christian worship presents us with God's real-world perspective as we celebrate God's resurrection of Jesus. We take this real-world perspective to the nearby world. Christian growth shows up as vocational discipleship. We equip members to be Ministers in Daily Life.

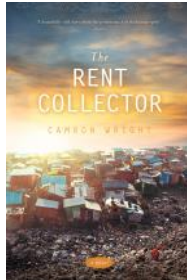
LIVE from St. John's on Tuesday, December 3 @ 7PM

A Message from Linda Finger of the Stewardship Task Force

The hardwood trees up in our beautiful Blue Ridge mountains this weekend were pretty well bare, their lovely fall colors gone, only the leaves piled around their massive trunks, or blowing around the roads nearby. It made the bare branches and limbs much more prominent, and showed the structure of the trees that we more often see covered with foliage, dark green boughs in summer, or red and gold in the autumn. Through the seasons of the year, the months going by, we in our trips to the mountains love seeing the beautiful forested slopes. Sometimes we even take them for granted, yet they are always there. Strong, ancient, giving shade or shelter, bending with storms, sometimes losing branches, still those sturdy trunks remain, exuding strength, reminding us of their enduring nature.

Of course, you know where I'm going with this... this season of our church year, our season of giving. I thought back on the forty-five plus years I have been a part of this church family. It's been a family tree for me, in a lot of ways. A place where I can find myself on the branch with my kids, and my husband who grew up here on the St. John's tree (probably climbing like a monkey through the branches!). I have watched the seasons of the tree go around, year by year, have known the shelter of the strong branches here, and have nested here. I've observed how those limbs reach far out into the neighborhoods and the community around St. John's, and how the love and nourishment of our church has helped our community grow strong, too. **(continued in next column)**
