He enjoys reading, especially history, fiction and biography books and cheers for the Wake Forest Demon Deacons and Georgia Bulldogs.

The need for CBF emerged as free and faithful Baptists rejected political fundamentalism in the 1980s. CBF was formed officially in 1991. Today, CBF includes thousands of congregations, more than 1,000 endorsed chaplains and pastoral counselors, many field personnel serving around the world, 17 state and regional organizations, dozens of theological schools, and ministry partners. St. John's collaborates closely with CBF as we respond to global disasters and support theological education.
