"If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless. CONNECTING SUNDAY WORSHIP WITH DAILY LIFE

To support your spiritual growth, we encourage you to invest in contemplation each day.

These thoughts may help you in your reflections.

1. Write out your thoughts in response to this question: 'What does spirituality mean to you?'

- 2. How are you fulfilling these St. John's Church Covenant commitments? We will be faithful to the public worship of God, gathering with the family of the Church to celebrate his glory and remember his grace. We will take seriously the responsibility and privilege of personal Christian growth, diligently seeking to establish and maintain a Christian atmosphere in our homes.
- 3. Reflect on this verse of scripture from Philippians 3:10 "I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death,..."
- 4. Marjorie Thompson, in Soul Feast, suggests two basic truths that help us engage in self-examination, so it contributes to our spiritual growth: (1) God loves you and is always offering you opportunities to experience the blessed life. (2) You are like every other human in that you are broken by sin, imperfect, and limited in your capacity to accomplish everything you can imagine. Each day, invest two minutes to embrace God's love of you and two minutes to confess your sins and ask God for power and courage to become more like Christ.
- 5. How do you understand connections between inward spiritual growth and outward expressions of faith? How is your life been enriched when you experience these connections?
- 6. Psalm 63:1-4 O God, you are my God; I seek you; my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water. So I have looked upon you in the sanctuary, beholding your power and glory. Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you. So I will bless you as long as I live; I will lift up my hands and call on your name.
- 7. We hear much today about, "spiritual but not religious," "declining church," "moralistic therapeutic deism," "the secular age," and "the Nones." What do you think might happen if we changed our emphasis to focus on practices such as prayer, spiritual growth, renewal, and embodying the worship and ministry life of Jesus?
