Based on Psalm 19 and 1 Corinthians 1:18-25

ONE: God's glory is on tour in the skies, God-craft on exhibit across the horizon. A teacher named Day reveals God's Truth in classes every morning. Professor Night lectures each evening.

ALL: The revelation of GOD integrates us; God's Truth pulls our lives together. The signposts of GOD are clear and point out the right road. The life-maps of GOD are right and show us the way to joy. The directions of GOD are plain and easy to understand.

John 2:13-22

The Passover of the Jews was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple he found people selling cattle, sheep, and doves, and the money changers seated at their tables. Making a whip of cords, he drove all of them out of the temple, both the sheep and the cattle. He also poured out the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. He told those who were selling the doves, "Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!"
